






- 1 Shows the extent of what was Sun Barn Farm.
 This land is now covered by housing and the fire station.



- 1** Across the road this patch of buildings and yards probably contained the cart sheds and stabling for the farm. Photos of Whitwell Road/School Road show these buildings which eventually became a garage site for a John White and later the Massey & Bridges premises with its art deco frontage. This frontage still exists today - 2021. Opposite can be seen the Sun Barn Pit.
- 2, 3 & 4** A mixture of maltings, warehouses, yards & cottages. Harry Hawes had his builder's yard & premises here. Part of this area was purchased later by John Walker who already had his furniture stores on this site. He used the land to build the Methodist Hall for Band of Hope activities.
- 5 & 6** Fred Gibbs lived here with his watchmaker & tobacconist shop, coloured green, and William Pask ran his tailoring business from the building coloured red. Note that the building is already the property of Pask's.
- 7** Edward Gibbs, the ironmonger, held the tenancy of this 'enclosure of garden ground'.
