Be it remembered that on the twenty fifth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy seven the Reverend Charles Thomas Jex Blake of Lyng in the County of Norfolk Clerk in Holy Orders a Copyhold Tenant of the said manor came before me Charles Searle Deputy Steward of the said manor for this turn and purpose only and in pursuance of his covenant for that purpose contained in a certain Indenture bearing date the twenty fourth day of May One thousand eight hundred and seventy seven and made between the said Charles Thomas Jex Blake of the one part and William Heitland Blake of Newcastle under Lyme in the County of Stafford Gentleman of the other part and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred pounds the apportioned consideration on the sale of the Copyhold hereditaments hereinafter expressed to be surrendered to him the said Charles Thomas Jex Blake paid by the said William Heitland Blake the receipt whereof is by the said Indenture acknowledged Did out of Court according to the custom of the said manor surrender out of his hands into the hands of the Lord of the said manor by the hands of the said Deputy Steward by the rod in the presence and testimony of Joseph Nelson a credible person attesting the same all and every the messuages lands tenements and

hereditaments whatsoever situate lying and being within and holding of the said manor by Copy of Court Roll which the said Charles Thomas Jex Blake together with Mary Blake widow and Arthur Allan Heitland Esquire both since deceased had and took up within their heirs and assigns under and by virtue of the last Will and Testament of the Reverend Henry William Blake late of Thurning in Norfolk Clerk in Holy Orders deceased at a court held for the said manor on the seventh day of February one thousand eight hundred and sixty and all the rights members privileges and appurtenances whatsoever to the said hereditaments belonging or in anywise appertaining and all the estate right little interest use trust inheritance property possession power claim and demand whatsoever (legal and equitable) of the said Charles Thomas Jex Blake therein and thereto to the only proper use and behoof of the said William Heitland Blake his heirs and assigns for ever absolutely and without any manner of condition whatsoever at the will of the Lord and according to the custom of the said manor and by and under fines rents suits and services therefore due and of right accustomed.
